

Emergency Town Council Meeting Minutes

March 20, 2020

The Town Council of the Town of Corydon, Indiana, met in the Town Hall, 219 North Capitol Av, Corydon, Indiana on the 20th day of March 2020 at the hour of 9:00 am., in an emergency meeting call in accordance with the rules of the Council.

The meeting was called to order by Lester Rhoads, who presided and the pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by the Council.

On call of the roll, the members of the Council were shown to be present or absent as follows:

Town Manager Rand Heazlitt is on two-week voluntary confinement after returning from abroad and he joined the meeting via phone while Town Attorney Chris Byrd and Clerk- Treasurer Treggie King, also attended the meeting.

The meeting minutes of March 3, 2020 and the special called meeting of March 13, 2020 were reviewed by the Council. Tyson Uhl made a motion to approve the minutes and Paul Hamann seconded the motion and the motion passed 4-0.

Resolution 2020-03 of the Town of Corydon waiving certain procedures and formalities during disaster emergencies pursuant to IC 10-14-3-12 and IC 10-14-3-7 was presented by Town Attorney Chris Byrd. Hope Schneider made a motion to approve the resolution and Tyson Uhl seconded the motion which carried 4-0.

Rand Heazlitt suggested the Council consider downtown businesses be allowed to use cones provided by the Town to create drop off and delivery zones in parking spaces in front of their businesses in order to allow the merchants to assist merchants in continuing to provide their services to customers. The Council determined that emergency plans approved by Town Manager Rand Heazlitt and Council President Les Rhoads be implemented during this crisis. Paul Hamann made a motion to approve the broad scope of emergency measures by handled in this manner. Hope Schneider seconded the motion and the vote was 4-0.

Uhl Truck sales delivered the Street Department truck, a 2020 International, per the order placed and approved by the former Council. Tyson Uhl made a motion to approve the payment of \$110,312.85 to the vendor and Paul Hamann seconded the motion. The motion carried 4-0.

A brief mention was made about the Main Street funding request due to a letter that was sent to the Council members from Angel Frizzell. The Council did not feel this was a priority to be discussed during a time of emergency. Paul Hamann asked the Clerk-Treasurer for the revenue amount the Town receives from sales tax. In response to his question she responded that she would prepare a specific report that she would provide to the Council that shows all the revenue streams the Town receives. She also volunteered to provide information to Council members about the revenue provided to Main Street for the past several years.

There being no further business and upon a motion made by Hope Schneider and seconded by Tyson Uhl, the meeting adjourned.
