

Corydon Town Council
Meeting Minutes
February 15, 2022

The Town Council of the Town of Corydon, Indiana, met in the Town Hall, 219 North Capitol Ave, Corydon, Indiana on the 15th day of February 2022 at the hour of 7:00 p.m., in regular meeting pursuant to call in accordance with the rules of the Council.

The meeting was called to order by Hope Schneider and Pam Byrne presided over the pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

On call of the roll, the members of the Council were shown to be present or absent as follows:

Town Attorney Chris Byrd attended the meeting. Town Manager Scott Flickner and Clerk-Treasurer Treggie King were absent.

Harlan Fisher made motion to approve minutes of the February 1st meeting and Les Rhoads seconded the motion with an approval vote of 4-0.

Paul Hamann motioned to approve claims and sign bills. Les Rhoads seconded the motion, it carried 4-0.

There was nothing for Planning and Zoning.

C & R Construction won the award for the "re-bid" for the Water Main Replacement Harrison Drive project, with the motion made by Les Rhoads. The project amount for MEI#2020086 is \$267,795.00. Paul Hamann seconded, and it carried 4-0. Mr. Rhoads stated the first bidding process came in at \$456K using steel piping. The re-bid was for a high-grade plastic piping, to which several communities have switched.

The Community Crossing Round 2 project, involving Farquar Avenue, was awarded to C & R Construction in the amount of \$325,500.00. INDOT will pay 80% of this project and will help with the drainage issue on Farquar Avenue. The motion to approve was made by Harlan Fisher and seconded by Paul Hamann. The motion carried 4-0.

Cemetery Caretaker, Jim Smith, introduced Thomas Schad, who will be mowing the Cemetery starting this year, 2022. The former company had increased their prices by 25%, and Mr. Schad came in at a lower price of \$1,500.00 a mowing. Mr. Schad's company also provides snow removal. Mr. Smith stated there has been no progress on the new cemetery fence because the company is still waiting on product to come in for delivery. He advised the company that they could remove the current chain link fence in order to prepare for installation.

Chris Byrd updated the Council about property along Big Indian Rd, near the former dam, which is to be deeded back to the Thieneman family. Mr. Byrd stated the deed and title search has been completed and will be billed to the Town for payment. After the bill is paid, that amount will be reimbursed to the Town from the Thieneman family. Mr. Byrd asked the Council to allow President Schneider to sign the deed back to the family. Harlan Fisher made the motion, Les Rhoads seconded, and it passed 4-0. Mr. Rhoads stated the other dam, which is privately owned, will be considered for possible demolition. The liability insurance on said dam has risen to \$1,000,000.00 for the property owner

Bids for painting and cleaning of the north water tank will be accepted on March 10th at 2:00 pm at the Town Hall.

There being no further business to come before the Council and upon a motion to adjourn, made by Harlan Fisher and seconded by Paul Hamann, the meeting adjourned.
