

Town of Corydon
Council Minutes July 5, 2022

The Town Council of the Town of Corydon, Indiana, met in the Town Hall, 219 North Capitol Ave, Corydon, Indiana on the 5th day of July 2022 at the hour of 7:00 p.m., in regular meeting pursuant to call in accordance with the rules of the Council. The meeting was called to order by Hope Schneider and presided over the pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

On call of the roll, the members of the Council were shown to be present or absent as follows:

Town Manager, Scott Flickner, and Town Attorney, Chris Byrd, attended the meeting. Clerk-Treasurer, Treggie King was absent.

Harlan Fisher made motion to approve minutes of the June 21, 2022, meeting and Paul Hamann seconded the motion with an approval vote of 5-0.

Paul Hamann motioned to approve claims and sign bills. Harlan Fisher seconded the motion; it carried 5-0.

Amanda Uhl did not attend the meeting to request a police escort through Town for a Jamboree at St. Joseph. Janelle Amy of Main Street also did not attend the meeting to update the Council on future events.

The final invoice approval for Casey Electric was motioned by Harlan Fisher and seconded by Les Rhoads, in the amount of \$10,000.00. The project was for the generators at the Water Tower office. The motion passed 5-0.

Carla Clunie and Justin Lessen of the Harrison County Fair Board, spoke of the need for a new grandstand at the fairgrounds, and that funding was needed from various sources to help pay for it. A used 10-year-old Nascar grandstand, which has been sat on 10 times, for \$1.8 million, seating 5000, will be purchased if funding from grants, the Harrison County Council, Harrison County Community Foundation, and Town give money towards the purchase. Ms. Clunie stated a new grandstand would cost approximately \$2,140,000.00. The old grandstand was built in the 1920's and put into place for the Harrison County Fairgrounds in 1961 and is beyond repair. The "new" grandstand would be covered, have handicap accessibility, have space underneath for vendors booths, and consist of 2 walkways. The Fair Board will be asking for donations from the Harrison County Township Trustee, Tyson Foods, the Republican party, and other entities. The Council recognized the need to help with the funding, but Doug Castetter wanted to ask the advice of Clerk-Treasurer, Treggie King, on what fund the monies would come from. Ms. Clunie asked for \$50,000.00 from the Town. Attorney Chris Byrd agreed the Council speak with Ms. King and suggested a continuance of this meeting at a later day and time to make the final decision.

Scott Flickner reported in old business, parking on Maple Street, Summit Street, and High Street is still an issue with motorists not being able to see to make turns or pull out onto the road. Cars and trailers are parked blocking line of sight and causing a hazard to drivers. Chief Kitterman cannot issue tickets or warnings because there is not an ordinance in place. Concerned citizens are on the agenda for the next Council meeting to speak of the issue.

Mr. Flickner stated in updates that 2 properties will receive certified letters to mow their lots or liens will be placed. Those addresses are 90 Old Hwy 135 and 96 Loweth Avenue. The new sewer press was delivered today, July 5th and training will be scheduled at a later date. The old sewer press will be picked

up from the company. The next meeting, discussions will take place on the new maintenance building on the Cemetery property. A building permit will have to be issued through Homeland Security and approved by an engineer, then county permits can be obtained. All quotes should be in hand by the next meeting, July 19th.

Harlan Fisher asked if the purchased hydrants had been installed yet, and they had not.

There being no further business to come before the Council and upon a motion to reconvene Thursday July 7th at 6:00 pm, made by Les Rhoads and seconded by Paul Hamann, the meeting recessed.
