

Corydon Town Council
Meeting Minutes
March 2, 2021

The Town Council of the Town of Corydon, Indiana, met in the Town Hall, 219 North Capitol Ave, Corydon, Indiana on the 2nd day of March 2021 at the hour of 7:30 p.m., in regular meeting pursuant to call in accordance with the rules of the Council.

The meeting was called to order by Lester Rhoads who presided, and the meeting began with the pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

On call of the roll, the members of the Council were shown to be present or absent as follows:

Chris Byrd, the Town Attorney, Town Manager Scott Flickner and Clerk- Treasurer Treggie King also attended the meeting.

Paul Hamann made a motion to approve the meeting minutes of February 16, 2010 and Harlan Fisher seconded the motion. The motion was approved with a 4-0 vote.

Hope Schneider made the motion to approve claims and sign bills. Harlan Fisher seconded the motion, and it carried 4-0.

Lynn Walsh was on the agenda to discuss funding for the Christmas Train; however, Ms. Walsh was not present at the meeting.

Harlan Fisher made the motion to adopt Resolution #2021-01 to submit the Phase III Covid Immediate Response application to OCRA. Hope Schneider seconded and it carried 4-0.

Susan Mills addressed the Council regarding Ordinance 2021-2 for Town of Corydon Business License. Ms. Mills explained that the license is free to the merchants. The business license will aid the Police and Fire Department with emergency information by providing the type of business, and the name, phone and email of business and property owner in case of an emergency. This will also allow each business to understand operational components of being in a historic district and zoning regulations. Ms. Mills stated that businesses who fail to comply with the ordinance by a date set by the Town Council would result in a fine of \$25 per day. Doug Castetter opposed the fine. Harlan Fisher made the motion to adopt ordinance 2021-2; Paul Hamann seconded the motion which carried 4-1. Doug Castetter voted nay.

Paul Hamann made the motion authorizing the Clerk-Treasurer to pre-pay \$5,035.00 to Harrison Co REMC to relocate electric pole for the ICON lift station upgrade and rehabilitation and to allow the Town Manager to sign the application. Scott Flickner stated the electric pole is located on Landmark Way and

this decision will allow C&R to continue the ongoing project without delays. Hope Schneider seconded the motion which carried 5-0.

Sign Ordinance #2021-01 from Planning and Zoning Ordinance had been approved at the last council meeting; however, it was submitted at this meeting for signatures.

The Town Manager updated the council on the lift station projects that C&R Construction has started including a new diversion valve at El Nopalito's Restaurant. The new shut off valve will allow the WWTP for shut of flow to WWTP 2 when necessary. He also stated the Street Department worked 67.5 hours of overtime due to the inclement weather; he advised the Council that the purchase of salt will need to be added to the budget expenses next year. He continued to update the Council regarding a meeting with Midwestern Engineers; the topic was centered around the Asset Management Plan. He explained to the Council if the Town ever applied for local, state, or federal grant money, this information would be required, and it would be easily accessed from the Asset Management Plan information. He reiterated it would take every Department Supervisor working on the plan to obtain all the required information needed for completion.

In closing, Mr. Flickner recommended the Council approve his request to repair the WWTP 2 parking lot. The cost for C&R Construction to make the repair and add on to the parking lot is \$14,200. Lester Rhoads made the motion to approve, Harlan Fisher seconded, and the motion carried 5-0. When asked by Mr. Fisher how the claim would be paid, Clerk Treasurer Treggie King stated the money will be paid from the sewer bond money.

Scott Flickner provided an update on the Rice Island walk through and reported a few small things to be addressed. He concluded that the warmer weather would allow the wall and sidewalk construction in front of the playground to get underway.

There being no further business to come before the council a motion to adjourn was made by Paul Hamann and seconded by Harlan Fisher, the meeting adjourned.
