

Corydon Town Council
Meeting Minutes
November 2, 2021

The Town Council of the Town of Corydon, Indiana, met in the Town Hall, 219 North Capitol Ave, Corydon, Indiana on November 2, 2021, at the hour of 7:00 p.m., in regular meeting pursuant to call in accordance with the rules of the Council.

Lester Rhoads called the meeting to order and presided over the pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

On call of the roll, the members of the Council were shown to be present or absent as follows:

Clerk-Treasurer Treggie King and Town Manager Scott Flickner were in attendance. Chris Byrd, Town Attorney, was absent.

Harlan Fisher made the motion to approve minutes of the November 1, 2021, meeting and Hope Schneider seconded the motion with an approval vote of 3-0.

Harlan Fisher made the motion to approve claims and sign bills. Lester Rhoads seconded the motion and the motion carried 3-0.

Stewart Penwell, from the Harrison County Leadership class of 2022, explained that Harrison County Leadership is a nonprofit organization in Harrison County for past 25 years. One aspect of the program required each class to choose a group project that will leave a lasting impact on the community. Mr. Penwell's class has chosen to supply grave markers for several of the unmarked graves in Cedar Hill Cemetery. Mr. Penwell stated the class will fundraise for the project. James Smith, the caretaker Cedar Hill Cemetery, commented that he has spoken to Mr. Penwell about the size of the markers and the materials from which the markers will be made. Mr. Smith is waiting on quotes for bulk pricing from local companies to give to Mr. Penwell. President Lester Rhoads, Hope Schneider and Harlan Fisher agreed it is a noble undertaking and would like for Mr. Penwell to keep the board informed.

Hope Schneider made the motion to approve bond #999080714 for Officer Johnathan Ward and bond# 99080713 for Officer Terry Bartle. Harlan Fisher seconded the motion and it carried 3-0.

Harlan Fisher motioned to approve a Service Agreement between REMC and the Town in the amount of \$7,150.00 President Rhoads explained the agreement was the expense of installation for the transformers during the changeover for the newly installed generator at 9910 Hillcrest Dr. Mauckport, IN. Hope Schneider seconded the motion which carried 3-0.

Town Manager Scott Flickner requested Council approval for the upcoming holiday schedule. The Christmas scheduled holidays will be December 23rd & 24th. December 30, 2021, offices will close for New Year's Eve and December 31st the offices will close for New Year's Day. The Council approved the holiday schedule per the Employee Personnel Handbook.

Mr. Flickner discussed the need to finalize a plan for the Urban Trail project for the sidewalks on Chestnut Street. Mr. Rhoads expressed the necessity to have a decision in order for DLZ Engineers to have detailed information and estimates to submitted to the State for approval and time for the State to respond. Mr. Flickner stated Jill Saegesser (Wheatly Group) will also be present at the meeting.

President Rhoads has not heard from the State concerning the eight parking spaces they removed when the State installed the crosswalk on Chestnut Street. He hopes to have resolution before the end of the year.

Susan Mills presented police reports for Chief Matt Kitterman. Reserve Officer Mills stated the new police vehicle will be available for use within the next couple of weeks. Harlan Fisher asked about a damaged police car. Ms. Mills reported the damaged vehicle has been repaired and she reported one of the older police cars will be going to auction.

Scott Flickner provided an update for the generator at Mauckport by saying the electrician completed the installation, however, we are waiting for REMC to transfer the electric. Mr. Flickner also reported the new roof at the maintenance building is complete except for the insulation strips that need to be installed. The new roof for the Town Hall was completed November 1, 2021, and the water tank by the maintenance building has been drained because the coating on the inside of the tank must be repaired.

There being no further business to come before the Council and upon a motion to adjourn made by Harlan Fisher and seconded by Hope Schneider, the meeting adjourned.
