

ORDINANCE NO. 1939-D

An Ordinance fixing the schedule of rates or charges to be collected by the Town of Corydon, Indiana, from the owners of property served by the sewage disposal plant and works of said Town. *Sewer*

WHEREAS, the Town of Corydon has built and has in operation a sanitary sewer system for the purpose of collecting sanitary sewage and conveying the same away from the premises where produced to a place of disposal; and

WHEREAS, the Town is now constructing works for the treatment and disposal of sewage under the provisions of Chapter 61 of the Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana for the year 1932, and all acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto, and pursuant to Ordinance No. 1938-B adopted by the Board of Town Trustees on *July - 19 - 1938*; and

WHEREAS, said Chapter 61 of the Acts of 1932, as amended, requires that the rates or charges collected for the use of and the service rendered by said sewage disposal works be fixed by ordinance, after due notice and public hearing; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Town Trustees of the Town of Corydon, Indiana:

SECTION 1. Rates or charges shall be collected for the use of and the service rendered by said sewage disposal works from the owners of each and every lot, parcel or real estate or building that is connected with or uses such sewage disposal works by or through any part of the sewerage system of the Town, or in any way uses or is served by said sewage disposal works, which rates or charges shall be payable as hereinafter provided and in an amount determinable as follows:

(a) The rates or charges shall be based on the use of

or service rendered by said sewage disposal works in each monthly period by or to the property or premises subject to said rates or charges, in accordance with the schedule hereinafter set forth.

(b) The monthly schedule on which the amount of such rates or charges shall be determined shall be as follows:

- (a) Sewer service charges shall be based upon metered or estimated amounts of water used which water is discharged as waste to or through the public sewer system.
- (b) Industrial wastes requiring more treatment than domestic sewage or having a greater biochemical oxygen demand than domestic sewage shall be the subject of a reasonable additional charges, dependent upon the increased amount of treatment required.
- (c) Domestic sewage originating on property served only by the Corydon municipal water department, where such use of water is metered, shall be subject to the following Sewer Service charges:

For use of sewerage system for discharge of laundry waste where laundry water is obtained from sources other than the public supply, there shall be an additional charge per family of Five Cents (\$0.05)  
 The minimum monthly charge for any sewer service shall be Fifty cents (\$0.50)

- (d) Domestic sewage originating on property served by the Corydon municipal water department where water is sold on a flat rate, or where water is obtained from other sources, shall be subject to the following Sewer Service charges:

Where dwelling property is furnished with lavatory or kitchen sink, or one of each such fixtures, the charge per month shall be \$ 0.50

Charges per month for dwelling properties having more fixtures than one kitchen sink and one lavatory, shall be as follows:

For each toilet	\$ 0.15
For each additional toilet	\$ 0.10
For each <sup>additional</sup> lavatory or kitchen sink	\$ 0.05
For each bathtub or shower	\$ 0.10
For each additional bathtub <i>or shower</i>	\$ 0.05
The minimum monthly charge for any service shall be	\$ 0.50

(e) Charges per month for non-dwelling properties, shall be as follows:

For each public toilet	\$1.50
For each public urinal	.50
For each private toilet	.50
For each lavatory	.25
For each hotel room with bath	.15
For each hotel room without bath	.10
For each restaurant, per seat	.10
For each garage or filling station wash rack	1.00
For each barber shop or beauty shop (1 chair or booth)	.75
For each additional chair or booth	.20
Schools, for each registered pupil	.06

The minimum monthly charge for any non-dwelling property served shall be 1.00

(f) In the event sewer service is applied for and such service cannot be classified in accordance with above measured or flat rates, such property will pay a charge comparable to amount and strength of waste discharged, using as a basis of comparison the amount and strength of sewage discharged by a dwelling housing one family of 3 persons.

(g) Water used in manufacturing processes, or such other purposes where such use does not produce waste discharged to the public sewer system, shall not be subject to a sewer service charge.

(h) The above rates shall apply to any and all use of public sewer system by the Town of Corydon, or any agency or instrumentality thereof, and shall be paid for as charges accrue.

(i) Establishments discharging wastes to the sanitary sewers which because of volume or character place a burden upon the plant in addition to the burden caused by the wastes contributed by its employees or inmates provided for above, shall pay an additional charge, which charge shall be based on the volume and character of the additional wastes discharged into the Town's sanitary sewage system and shall be proportionate to the base rate set out in

(j) For service rendered to the Town of Corydon, said Town shall be subject to the same charges or rates hereinabove provided for.

(k) Such rates or charges shall be billed monthly by the Clerk-Treasurer, and shall be due and payable at the office of the Clerk-Treasurer on or before the tenth day of the calendar month next succeeding the date of the billing; provided, however, that the first billing may be for a longer or shorter period in order that the Town may establish convenient regular monthly billing dates.

(l) The Town shall have the right to measure and determine the volume and strength of all sewage and wastes discharged either directly or indirectly into the Town's sanitary sewerage system, in such manner and by such method as it may find practicable, in the light of the conditions and attending circumstances of the case, in order to determine the proper charge in accordance with the rate schedule provided in this ordinance.

Section 2. The rates or charges fixed herein shall be extended to and cover any additional premises hereafter served, without the necessity of any hearing or notice. If any rate or charge herein established shall not be paid within thirty (30) days after the same is due, a statement thereof shall be placed in the hands of the Town Attorney by the Clerk-Treasurer

and it shall be the duty of the Town Attorney to institute a civil action in the name of the Town to recover the amount thereof, together with a penalty of ten per cent (10%) and reasonable attorneys fees, as provided by statute.

Section 3. Prior to the final adoption of this ordinance notice of the introduction thereof and of a public hearing thereon shall be given by publication for one time in the Corydon Democrat, a newspaper printed and published and of general circulation in the Town of Corydon, which notice shall include a copy of this ordinance.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and signing thereof.
