DISCRETIONARY ORDER NO. W-11, REVISED JULY 1976

SQUIRREL

WHEREAS, it has been determined after thorough investigation that a limited season for the taking of tree squirrels, Genus Sciurus, is feasible; and

WHEREAS, said determination has been based on data relative to the welfare of tree squirrels, their relationship to other animals; and the welfare of the people;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Joseph D. Cloud, Director of the Department of Natural Resources, acting pursuant to the authority of the Acts of 1969, Chapter 70, as found in the Indiana Code 1971, 14-2-3-3; and having given notice and held a public hearing as required by the Acts of 1945, Chapter 120, as found in the Indiana Code 1971, 4-22-2, hereby make the following order to be known as Discretionary Order No. W-11.


CLOSED SEASON


1. It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, take, possess, sell, offer for sale, purchase, offer to purchase, or to ship, transport, carry, or deliver or receive for shipment, transportation, or carriage in any manner beyond the limits of this state gray squirrels, Sciurus Carolinensis, fox squirrels, Sciurus Niger, and their white or black color phases, and flying squirrels, Genus Glaucomys, or any part thereof, except as otherwise provided.

OPEN SEASON AND GENERAL PROVISIONS

2. The open season for hunting, taking, and possessing gray squirrels, Sciurus Carolinensis, and fox squirrels, Sciurus Niger, does not include the flying squirrel or the white or black color phase of the gray and fox squirrel, shall extend from the 15th day of August through the third (3rd) Friday of October and during the seven day period immediately following deer hunting with long bow and arrow.
3. The open season for hunting, taking, and possessing gray squirrels, Sciurus Carolinensis, and fox squirrels, Sciurus Niger, does not include the flying squirrel or the white or black color phase of the gray and fox squirrel, within the boundaries of Atterbury, Crosley, Glendale, Jasper-Pulaski, Kingsbury, LaSalle, Patoka, Pigeon River, Tri-County, Willow Slough and Winamac Fish and Wildlife Areas shall extend from 15 August through 31 December.
4. The open season for taking gray squirrels, Sciurus Carolinensis, and fox squirrels, Sciurus Niger, does not include the flying squirrel or the white or black color phase of the gray and fox squirrel, within the boundaries of the Mogan Ridge Wild Turkey Management Unit on U.S. Forest Service land in Perry County shall be from the 15th day of August through the 30th day of September.
5. No person shall take more than five (5) fox squirrels or gray squirrels singly or in the aggregate in any one day; and shall not have in his possession, or ship, carry or transport in this State more than ten (10) fox squirrel and gray squirrel singly or in the aggregate after the second (2nd) day of lawful hunting.
6. No person shall take any tree squirrels from or by use of a motor-driven conveyance.






